# **TOOLS & MATERIALS**

As shown in picture above, top row (left to right):

- Pre-mixed syrup (Sculpey liquid & oil paint)
- Pre-made butter pats
- Prismacolor Nu Pastels (sticks), #233 Raw Sienna, and #313 Nut Brown
- Razor blades to scrape chalks sticks to powder
- Two containers of chalk dust (one with 50:50 mix of #233 and #313, and one with #313 chalk)
- Circle cutters

# Bottom row (left to right):

- Eyeshadow applicators (for applying chalks)
- Popsicle sticks
- Dotting tools
- Old toothbrush
- Needle tool or toothpicks
- Pre-mixed clay (Fimo clay in 3 parts White, 1 part Vanilla, 1 part Translucent)
- Finished pieces
- Brayer

# INSTRUCTIONS

Always use tools & baking pans dedicated to POLYMER CLAY USE ONLY!!! Line baking pan with parchment or cardstock to prevent clay from being shiny.

Always make sure your hands are clean when working with clay. I use a lot of baby wipes. Do not touch food after working with clay, until you wash your hands (clay does leave a residue on your hands).

# PROCEDURE

- Soften clay in your hands
- Stack popsicle sticks 2 high & use brayer or rolling pin to roll out
- Cut out pancakes with 3/4" cutter (1:6 scale)
- Lightly soften edges of pancakes with your fingers
- With smallest dotting tool, needle tool or toothpick: texture the edges of your pancake
- Lightly texture top & bottom of pancake with old toothbrush
- Using dotting tool make small indents in top & bottom of pancakes (small circles, comma shapes)
- Apply chalk with eyeshadow applicators (first with mix of 2 chalks, then darken with #313)
- Bake pancakes at 275 degrees for 30 minutes, let cool
- Add syrup and butter pat, bake again at 275 degrees for 20 minutes

# **BUTTER PAT RECIPE**

Mix 1 part Fimo Translucent Yellow & 1 part Fimo Vanilla. Roll out to about 1/8" thick and cut a small square, smooth edges over (can be put on syrup then baked with syrup).

I hope your dolls enjoy their pancakes!
